


## The Liberal Nationals' plan to get Victoria <u>Back to Work</u>

Prioritise Victorian Government purchasing and procurement from local suppliers, and make payment on government contracts within seven days.



Deliver 57,000 apprenticeship and traineeship commencements in the year to 31 March 2022, with retraining scholarships for people looking to re-skill in priority areas.
